- 2) <u>Integrated social services unit</u> to provide counseling in a diverse array of matters including mental health, family, and financial issues, as well as a food pantry and a shelter home.
- 3) <u>Facilitating access to public programs</u>, such as unemployment benefits, food stamps, energy assistance, Medicaid and CHIP insurance, and other public benefits available to indigent community members.

To cultivate a shared culture of care and action for community building in Philadelphia.


At the Core of Our Model...

- Collaboration with local Masjids and community organizations


Where We Stand Now

Organizational Structure (preliminary)




Patient Care Flow (preliminary)

 - Accessibility


Poorest access to medical care

The Lower Northeast

Area in square: close to several Masjids in lower Northeast (accessible to large Muslim community); very poor; worst access to care (officially designated as medically underserved); mostly minority
